

300TH ANNIVERSARY OF ST PAULS CATHEDERAL


A service of thanksgiving took place on Tuesday 21st June in the presence of Her Majesty The Queen, His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh and His Royal Highness The Duchess of Gloucester.

The service was to mark the anniversary of the present building which was designed by Sir Christopher Wren. It is, of course, Britain's only Baroque Cathedral.

The Dean, and the Right Reverend Graeme Knowles, preached the sermon. He reminded us that worship had taken place on the site for many years before the present building. He stressed the importance of people as well.

The music was varied and included some of my favourites Bruckner's (Locus Isle) and part of Haydn's Creation. We also sang "All for Jesus!" from Steiner's Crucifiction. My only disappointment was that there was so little coverage in the media.
