

Anything with God is possible. He can help us deal with our anxieties and insecurities about what the future holds for us as The Drive and for the Circuit as together we soldier on.

As I write, four of our members are in hospitals: Barbara Foster in Whips Cross; May Levett and Leota are in King George and Audrey is still in White Chapel expecting to be transferred to King George or Queen's. Your prayers and the occasional visit when you can are appreciated.

Fifteen members attended the meeting on 18th October chaired by Rev Bernardino Mandlate.

The chairman gave news of developments in the Circuit and the progress of discussions leading to the amalgamation of some churches.

The treasurer, Peter Foster, presented accounts for the previous year, which showed a small surplus (£540) for the year.

The cost of property maintenance had been kept within budget and spending of £12000 was approved for this year. Replacement of some windows by double glazed units was discussed and it was agreed that it would be better to rebuild cash reserves at present. The meeting approved the appointments of Lorraine Bendon and Ruth Joyce as class leaders.

The stewards were asked to undertake a review of the Mission Statement.
