

Inside was a book by Mr Rogers called 'When a Pet Dies'

Taped to the inside front cover was the letter we had written to God in its opened envelope.

On the opposite page was the picture of Abbey & Meredith and this note:

Dear Meredith,

Abbey arrived safely in heaven. Having the picture was a big help and I recognised her right away.

Abbey isn't sick anymore..

Her spirit is here with me just like it says in your heart.

Abbey loved being your dog.

Since we don't need our bodies in Heaven, I don't have any pockets to keep your picture in so I'm sending it back to you in this little book for you to keep and have something to remember Abbey by. Thank you for the beautiful letter and thank your mother for helping

you write it and sending it to me.

What a wonderful mother you have.

I picked her especially for you.

I send my blessings every day and remember that I love you so much.

By the way, I'm easy to find.

I am wherever there is Love.

Visit to The Drive Methodist Church by Redbridge Primary School

On the 15th of December 2013, 90 Year 2 children from Redbridge Primary visited The Drive to learn about the inside of a Christian church and how Christmas is celebrated in a church. They surprised us by turning up early but we were ready for them. There was some lively discussion about what is really important at Christmas, 'helping others' as well as 'celebration' were ideas mentioned. Frank introduced them to the organ and this caused some excitement as many had not heard live organ music before. 
