

#### Friends

It is that time of the Christian calendar again when we go through the motions of Lent. On Easter Sunday we will be giving towards mission in the world. May I suggest that if you have given up something for the Lent season, you give the equivalent savings of that to the mission of the church, be it overseas or local. But if you are like me and don't give up anything in particular for Lent, may I ask/suggest that you give something during Lent to help someone who is struggling in life to make ends meet. There has been severe flooding in Mozambique these past few weeks with about 70000 becoming homeless and a few dozens dead. There is desperation; some help is getting through to people. Same wave of floods affected north of South Africa and some places in Zimbabwe. This is just an example of the need out there to which we can and are able to respond.

I consider the season of Lent as a time of reflection on our individual and corporate lives and a time of penitence for mistakes we make in our lives; and it is a time when we ask God to have mercy on us sinners. But, allow me to say how difficult it is to forgive someone who is begging for forgiveness while carrying on making the same wrongs every day of his/her life.

That could be a difficulty that God has with us if we are not willing to change our ways. Penitence becomes meaningless if we are not ready to change. Change becomes necessary during Lent because it a good time to reflect on what Jesus did for each and everyone of us. He allowed himself to suffer pain and death on the cross so that he could take upon himself the burdens of our misgivings/sins. Would it be that he suffered for nothing? I believe that we need to show the Lord how sorry we are for inflicting that pain and failing to change and improve on our lifestyles.

Please, use his Lenten time to give to others and God will continue to bless you with forgiveness and provisions. Be honest to God and to yourself. Show God you are sorry for your past mistakes and move on. I pray that God will continue to bless us all and our church more. I pray that God will continue to show us ways in which we can continue to be welcoming to anyone coming through our doors for a visit or to join our worship. I pray that more and more of us will be able to engage with visitors and make them feel welcome, and made feel they belong with us.

Fast some days if you can, read the Bible and be prayerful during Lent at least.

May the Lord continue to bless each and every one.
