

#### Dear Friends

As I write, it is Pentecost, a day we remember the birth of the church the way we know it today. We are celebrating the birth of the early church. A church started when Peter preached the good news and about 3000 people accept Christ, according to Acts of the Apostles. It is a day that we celebrate diversity because God the Creator allowed people other than the Jews to access and be part of His kingdom.

They were, in Jerusalem, people from all over the known world then celebrate one of the many festivals celebrated in the city. They heard the word being spoken in their own languages, however many languages were represented, by people who had not been trained in any languages, people who were not quite educated and were mere fishermen by trade. #### **VALENTINE SINGERS CONCERT, SATURDAY 29th JUNE**

People often ask me when I try to sell tickets to Valentine Singers concerts, "Is it heavy?" Well, "heavy" or "light" is usually a matter of personal taste, but I would encourage you to come to Epping on Saturday 29th June to hear a concert featuring the music of Benjamin Britten. The main work is his cantata St Nicolas, which is very approachable and features two hymns for the audience to join in, so you get to sing with us as well! The following is the official Valentine Singers press release giving details of the concert. I hope you will be pestering me for a ticket very soon!

This summer Valentine Singers will be joining musicians around the world in celebrating Britten 100 – the centenary of composer Benjamin Britten, one of the leading composers of the twentieth century.

Music for amateur choirs and for children's voices forms a significant part of Britten's output. His

delightful cantata 'Saint Nicolas', composed in 1948, recounts the life and legends of Nicolas (aka Santa Claus!), fourth century Bishop of Myra – his early life, his imprisonment, and the wonders he wrought in God's name, including the resurrection of a group of pickled boys! He is still recognised as the patron saint of children, and their voices play an important part in the cantata.

The beautiful 'Cantata Misericordium' was composed for the centenary of the Red Cross organisation fifty years ago and first performed on the commemoration Day on 1st September 1963 in Geneva. Its performance this year therefore celebrates two anniversaries at once! This cantata tells the story of the Good Samaritan, posing the pertinent question, 'Who is thy neighbour?' The text is in Latin, reflecting the international theatre of Red Cross's operations and features tenor and baritone soloists alongside the chorus, strings, harp, piano and timpani.

Valentine Singers' Benjamin Britten 100 concert, which also features as part of the 2013 Epping Festival, is at St John the Baptist Church, Epping, at 7.30 on Saturday 29th June. The choir, conducted by Christine Gwynn, is supported by the excellent Jericho Ensemble, leader Elizabeth Porter, and a semi-chorus from Writtle Singers. The superb team of soloists is led by tenor Greg Tassell and baritone Tom Kennedy; treble Finley Barry sings young Saint Nicolas and three choristers from the Church of St Peter and St Paul Church, Chingford will feature as the "pickled boys"!

Tickets cost £15 (£8 for students/benefit holders), with a £2 reduction on all tickets bought before 22nd June. They may be obtained online from www.valentinesingers.org from the box office 020 8550 4654, from Epping Bookshop, or Mayfair Stationers in Barkingside.
