

MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Friends

As I am writing, two events are being celebrated, one is John Wesley's 'strangely warmed heart' and the other is Pentecost. Both of these have to do with the power of the Holy Spirit in energising the people of God into action and the proclamation of the good news for all.

John Wesley had been preaching for a good while and trained others to do the same, but without the touch of the Holy Spirit in his life. When his heart was 'strangely warmed' he felt the peace of God and was felt strengthened in his mission.

When the Holy Spirit touched the lives of the disciples in that room at Pentecost, it gave them the power they needed, it removed the fear they had and it got them out into the world and proclaimed the good news of the risen Lord. And as soon as they were touched by the Holy Spirit, they were out telling the story of Jesus.

Telling the story of Jesus is what we are about as Christians. Doing the mission of Jesus Christ is our duty as Christians at all times. Therefore, we have to be a community of action, reaching out to our community in faith and doing, where possible, what Jesus would have us do.

Yes if challenge ourselves to do better. We can all see the need around us, the need in the charities we already support. Let us do better, God will help us.

Let us all pray that Pentecost may have on us the same effect it had on Jesus' followers all those years ago. Let pray that, inspired by the Holy Spirit, we may move mountains in our pursuit of proclaiming God's truth and doing the gospel in our day to day activities, be they routine or new challenges.

May The Lord continue to bless each and everyone of us.
