He was always pleasant and friendly to everyone at church, at church lunches and when taking part in any church activities, which he regularly attended and helped at. He was always the first to give a hand with anything that needed doing however menial it might be. He could still drive and he was always ready to act as chauffeur for anyone who needed a lift anywhere or something taken somewhere, such as those who have difficulty getting to the shops or to the hospital or other appointments.

He never said much, but somehow he always seemed to be on the wavelength of anyone in any kind of trouble and there was always a gentle word of praise or encouragement for anyone to whom life was being less than kind. It gave him enormous pleasure to be of use, no matter how much it cost him in time, inconvenience or physical pain. When Anne Dellow set up a Brain Tumour charity in memory of her husband Ray he immediately volunteered to help in any way he could and it was not long before he was acting as a volunteer helper to sufferers and carers who came to Anne for help and advice. There are many who have cause to be grateful to this quiet, gentle man who had the great gift of being a wonderful listener.


The Drive Methodist Church aims to be faithful to the commandments of Jesus, and the calling of the Methodist Church.

Be a good neighbour to the immediate and wider community. Sharing our faith with others through pastoral care, church activities and communication.


