

A message from our Minister Revd. Bernardino Mandlate.

Friends

I trust that God has been as kind to you as he has been to me. Every time I look around, I see the hand of God at work in the midst of destruction, conflict, unhappiness, distrust, anxiety. Sometimes it is extremely difficult to see God at work when we feel that we are not faring well. Sometimes it is good to question whether God is with us, helping us, sharing our pain and misery. It may be difficult to see God in the midst of a struggling refugee camp.

There is a lot of symbolism is in what the Pope did a few weeks ago. Being the head of worldwide church as he is, he left the comfort of the Vatican to go and see firsthand the struggles and pain of refugees, to engage with them and hear their stories, to share in their pain and share with them the love of God. The Pope took with him twelve Syrian refugees to give them accommodation in the Vatican, a symbol of love, care and compassion. The twelve are all Muslims. Not that it matters but there is a bit of symbolism, in my view, with that choice. He could have chosen to take Christian families but, in Acts 11 Peter is instructed to eat whatever animals God has provided for him because God has made them clean. Peter Baptized Cornelius' household and then is taken to task by the religious authorities in Jerusalem, because he has made God accessible to Gentiles. But, as he explains, God gave them the Holy Spirit in the same way that was given to them. We are all God's.

We look forward to welcoming you all theregesture. It is the love of Christ being shared with God's people however they choose to worship him.

It is a good lesson for all of us to learn and try to put in practice. It is a good lesson and example for governments to follow. Sharing the love of God is everyone's responsibility, there are no excuses not love and care for others. There are no excuses not to give a helping hand to people in need around us.

Our church is slowly growing. It is always good to see a few people coming through our doors even if it's for simple visit, but especially a visit by those looking for a place to belong. We are a welcoming church and it feels good. God bless you. Dino

Music in Holy Week.

Each Tuesday evening during Lent, there were excellent talks and Bible studies on topical issues, for example, migration, slavery, famine. These meetings and the Maundy Thursday Service took place at St Andrew's Church in The Drive. Our choir master Andrew and The Drive Methodist church choir provided the music including "A new commandment" by Barbara Honeyball, as St Andrew's regular organist was away. The focal point of the service was the washing of feet, which was not compulsory.

On Good Friday, a walk of witness took place in Ilford Town centre. (other walks were available elsewhere in the Borough.) People came and went according to the times of their own church services. The walk was preceded by a service taken by Revd. Marie Segal at the Hospital Chapel. It was excellent. Prayers were said and hymns sung at various locations. Revd. Jenny Sweet led the devotions at Lynton House. Revd. Francis Ackroyd was the coordinator. The youngest participant was Abigail Clifton, whose parents are Naomi and John Clifton of the Salvation Army.

Haydon's "creation" was the "come and sing" work attempted at The Drive on Good Friday evening. Thanks to Barbara Fisher, a notice appeared in the Ilford Recorder. Forty eight singers took part and there was a good sized audience. The "Orchestra" was the brilliant pianist, Tim Smith, who is giving a recital at Chelmsford Cathedral on 20th May 2016. The best known chorus of "Creation" is "The Heavens are telling" which takes me back to Herne Hill Baptist Church, South

London and Bethesda United Church in Mississauga, Canada. On Good Friday we had a soprano and a tenor soloist. No volunteer bass soloist came forward. Some sections were sung by all the basses. Often a bass soloist was required. How did he do it? Andrew Taylor sang as well as conducting the choir. The event was to raise money for the Bahay ng pag-asa children's home in the Philippines.

On Easter Saturday two of us from The Drive choir went to St Mary's Woodford to hear London Forest choir sing Stainers Crucifixion. The conductor was Jonathan Rathbone. The libretto was written by W J Barrow Simpson, who was chaplain of Ilford Hospital chapel from 1904 – 1952. On Easter morning we gathered to sing Alleluias. I understand that the key was changed of the final alleluia. This was to fit in with the voluntary widor's toccata, the final movement of the fifth symphony. There is no need to go to Westminster Central hall or Westminster Abbey.

HMRC are changing the forms that we sign to confirm our wish for the Church to reclaim the Tax we have paid on our giving. Whilst this does not mean that we all have to sign new forms, I am copying below the part of the form that has changed so that everyone will be aware of the rules.

By completing this form you confirm:

"I am a UK taxpayer and understand that if I pay less Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all my donations in that tax year it is my responsibility to pay any difference."
