

#### Hi Friends

I trust that God has been watching over you as He has watched over me. He is gracious and caring. Friends, this is my last contribution to the newsletter before I move to Barking Methodist Church and the Revd Mmasape Zihle arrives in September.

Elizabeth and I have felt at home. We felt welcomed by all and we had a sense of belonging to the church family. This sense will continue as we are not leaving the circuit. We will still be with you and be around you to some degree. We will keep in contact with all of you and we would like you to keep in touch too. I am still your minister and you can still call me if you so feel inclined from time to time.

We've had a good nine years serving with you praying with you and sharing services together. We started experimenting with worship participation by members of the congregation which is great. I know there some of you still with reservations but I am glad that it is happening and if those with reservations are willing why not give it a go? The church needs to adapt to new realities, in the same way that we, as individuals, adapt to the changing society dynamics around us. We cannot, as a church, isolate/insulate ourselves from the world around us. In the same that we upgrade our homes, our gadgets, our diets, the life of the church and its worship need to be updated/upgraded/adjusted to what makes sense to modern communities. Let be open to God and allow ourselves to be challenged. Our hymn books have been updated a number of times so as to accommodate new hymns and songs. Some may still prefer to sing the old hymns in the old hymn books but we are aware of the new ones and it is good to sing them as well. God is at work in our lives and in our church too.

As you may remember, I mentioned before that I was working with a group of friends in Redbridge, from churches and Mosques, to bring a refugee family from Syria. I am happy now to let you know that the family has arrived in Redbridge. It's a family of six, the parents, two teenagers (boy and girl) a primary school young boy and an eight months old baby. We wish them well. They came from a refugee camp in Lebanon and are happy to be free at last. It was very emotional and overwhelming to see them arrive at their new home. Thanks to all who helped us make it possible through your donations and prayers. There are still many refugees out there in need of solidarity and help even as wars and conflicts continue unabated. Let us continue to pray to God for peace in the world and for an equitable share of the world's resources, respecting the environment.

We are still together. Blessings.

#### Notes from Circuit Meeting - 4th June

In order to try and maintain the staffing level, it is intended to apply for a probationer to start in 2020, when the Revd Angela Pothecary leaves the circuit, as it is felt that, having had two probationers who have been ordained this year, we stand a better chance of success than if we tried to get a presbyter. This will mean that in order to allow the probationer to not have the problem of going into a church with a big building scheme, some re-arrangement of the ministerial cover of the churches will have to be arranged. This is still being discussed by the leadership team and will be announced shortly.

As the Revd Ermal Kirby will be leaving the circuit in July, the Revd Bernardino Mandlate has accepted the Superintendancy of the circuit and has agreed to serve another three years from 2020 when he was due to move on, so will be with the circuit until August 2023.

#### **Gun and Knife Crime conference - 15th June**

Liz Amah and I attended this conference on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June at Methodist Central Hall, Westminster. The speakers came from a wide range of backgrounds and experience, but all had first hand knowledge of violence on the streets. Several had lost children through stabbing.

The prime mover of the conference was Richard Taylor, whose son, Damiola's death in Peckham caused an outcry. I couldn't believe that that happened twenty years ago. No doctor from A&E was able to attend. They were all too busy to take part.

The most powerful speaker was Sheldon Thomas, who had been a gang member and founded "Gangsline". I understand that he sometimes speaks on Radio London. Sheldon has definite views on the causes of the 'epidemic' of violence and what measures are needed to solve the problems.

Let us hope that those in a position to do something will have the courage to follow his advice.
