

Church Mission Statement of The Drive Methodist Church

Our Minister writes:

"So, what's the story?"

"What's the story in Balamory, wouldn't you like to know?" These are words to a song in a children's tv program. I found myself singing them every time I reflect on or think about the theme The President and Vice President of The Conference have chosen for this connexional year, ie. "So, What's the story?"

The charge is that we take time to tell our story, tell Christ's story and also to listen to others' stories. This is what I have begun doing over the last few weeks. Listening to the story of who are the people called Methodist here at The Drive; what are the challenges and what cause for joy and celebration do we have? One of the stories I have heard is of love for the church, the people in it and of the property we have. This is a cause for celebration. The challenge that comes alongside the celebration is the resourcing with willing and able people who will carry forward the love and work that goes in keeping our fellowship alive and ensures that the gifts we have continue to serve and enable the growth of God's kingdom.

As brothers and sisters we are called to watch over each other in love (1 Thessalonians 3:12). This means recognising when those who have been carrying the light or the banner for us grow weary and those who are following and feeling strong step up and ensure the torch or banner doesn't fall. Therefore it is important in hearing this story that as a church we begin to think about succession planning. This means that we identify or we volunteer ourselves to shadow those who hold offices in the church with the view of learning the role so that we can step up as the need arises. This will include encouraging even our young people to take active part in learning the ropes. It is also about encouraging good gifts in

each other, upholding good practice and calling out bad and divisive behaviour. Watching over one another in love is about being honest, sensitive and God centred for the flowering of our fellowship.

Another story is that of how we grow in our diversity. The conference has tasked districts, circuits and churches to engage with the marriage and relationships report. We are to honestly and with respect talk to each other about our understanding of marriage and also engage with the changing or divergent relationships we have with each other and others. I implore you to begin the conversation and to attend the organised sessions in our churches and within the district; so that when decisions are taken we are assured of our voices being included and heard.*

I pray that as we do this we may know how high, wide and vast is the love of God in Jesus for us.

Marriage and Relationships Consultation - District Conversation Day - 30th November






'Woven' - London District Conference 2020 - EARLY BIRD BOOKING AVAILABLE UNTIL 29TH NOVEMBER
