

In the month when we will be remembering those who gave up their lives to ensure that we continue to enjoy the liberties we have, I would like us to remember those who are living with dementia and other mental illnesses.

Many of us remember a time when our churches and chapels were full of enthusiastic worshippers of all ages and now we are bemoaning the dwindling numbers at our Sunday worship. We remember a time when families used to talk to each other, these days we text and tweet each other.


When our Lord Jesus dined with his friends and disciples on the night before he was betrayed and crucified; he broke bread and shared wine with them saying these are his body and blood broken and poured out for all and as often as they break bread with each other are to do so "in remembrance of me".






