Property Update

At the recent Church Council meeting approval was given to two proposals which relate to our property.

Firstly, the Council approved a maintenance budget of £13,000 for this financial year. Of this, £2000 will be spent renewing the carpet in the Parlour. It is significant that all of the remaining budget is required just to cover routine maintenance and service contracts. This shows the annual cost of simply keeping our premises in good order.

The second decision was to approve an additional spend of £6000 to erect two new large notice boards on the northern side of our premises. These will be positioned to give traffic travelling in both directions along Eastern Avenue a clear view. The boards will be used to promote our regular services, events and important festivals such as Christmas and Easter.



My First Sunday School Christmas Party

There have been so many Sunday School Christmas parties in our dear old church hall and I expect that the music, entertainment and even the food will be quite a bit different this year than it was way back in 1932 when I attended my very first Christmas party at The Drive Methodist Church. Life was a lot less complicated then than it is now, but even after all the years I've never forgotton that wonderful party and I can remember it vividly for it was so very special.

It was the very first fime I had even been in the brightly decorated hall and to me it was like the Guild Hall in London where Dad had taken me to see the statues of Gog and Magog.

I wore my one and only party dress, which was of yellow satin sprinkled with little pink roses and tied with a big pink sash. With it went ballet style slippers and I had a matching little dolly bag dangling from my wrist in which to keep my clean hanky, but to Mum's horror during tea I bunged two iced cakes in it to eat when I got home!

We played lovely noisy games – blind man's buff, musical chairs, pass the parcel, pin the tail on the donkey whilst blindfolded and oranges and lemons and we yelled ourselves hoarse.

There were long trestle tables covered in brilliantly white damask cloths and laden with big plates of paste sandwiches, fairy cakes with blobs of coloured icing on top, buttered fruit scones, lots of jellies, blancmanges and Symingtons Table Creams (which I understand are still available at a price from Fortnums and Masons) all made in fancy shaped moulds, not all of which had remained intact when being turned out, and alphabet and nursery rhyme biscuits and fizzy lemonade in paper cups which tended to go all soggy before you had drunk it all up.

After we'd demolished all the grub and made a right old mess with the crackers, put on paper hats and made crumbs everywhere we all got up and trundled back into the back room whilst the teachers and helpers cleared up.

First we had a Punch and Judy show, which I did not like at all because I thought Punch would get me next and I bawled blue murder, whereupon Mrs Smith (who taught the babies) scooped me up and gave me a big cuddle (it was not forbidden in those days!) I dried my eyes with a lace edged hanky which smelt faintly of lavender.

Then the curtains were drawn, a little portable screen was quickly put up, a camera whirled and we watched two short black and white silent films. One was Laurel and Hardy, which had us all falling about laughing and the other was called Cinderella and was meant to be taken seriously, but nobody's wig fitted and Prince Charming had a right old job forcing the glass slipper onto a visibly annoyed Cinderella's size 6.

Then we all trooped back to the main hall where our parents awaited us. Some joker had rearranged all the coats so there was a scramble to sort out which one belonged to who and Father Christmas who despite the white beard, really did look suspiciously like the Sunday School Superintendent, stood at the door and presented each of us with little parcel as we left – blue for boys and pink for girls. I've no idea what the blue ones contained but there were little gold filigree baskets in the pink ones, which held tiny phials of eau de Cologne. I was thrilled to the very core and treasured it for many years long after all the scent had evaporated, but like my lovely blue Bible sticker book it was destroyed with just about everything else when our house was bombed during the war.
