My Dear Friends,

As you know the Religious Education Resources Project (RERP) is the schools outreach arm of the BDI Circuit. News about the RERP usually comes to you via the supporters malting list, our Newsletters and the Annual Report, however to reach more people I am currently trying to give you updates via your church notices.

RE is a very contested subject In the curriculum at present with what should be taught, how and whether it should be mandatory or taught at all being topics up for debate. Teachers have little training on this subject now and often feel out of their depth. There are however still many very dedicated RE teachers trying to promote good RE in their schools and plenty of places in the curriculum where they are encouraged to invite in a speaker from a religious organisation to explain a theme from their religious prospective, or Indeed visit a religious place of worship. Such visitors are required to be familiar with current teaching practices, be able to give age appropriate information and to be trusted not to evangelize children. This is where the RERP comes In. These requests used to go to Ministers but since 2003 when the Project started they have been taken up by the key schools worker as part of the outreach of the Circuit.

My Annual Report for the last academic year has just been issued and you should be able to see a copy on your church notice board. Please read how we have continued to work with schools during the lockdown year and constantly evolve our practices in this ever changing Covid environment.

What I could not include In the report were the many funny but inspiring discussions with children and some of the frustrating technical difficulties all overcome. Only this week I was asked to cover Easter (during Advent), sorted out misunderstanding between fairies and angels and moved 60 children 3 times until a room was found with a working school computer for Zoom. When such difficulties are resolved I do sometimes wonder If God's hand was involved too.

I look forward to being in touch with you again in what I hope will be a regular item in your News sheets.

2nd December- UN INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ABOUTTON OF SLAVERY

According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO) more than 40 million people worldwide are victims of modern slavery. Although modem slavery is not defined In law, it is used as an umbrella term covering practices such as forced labour, debt bondage, forced marriage, and human trafficking. Essentially, it refers to situations of exploitation that a person cannot refuse or leave because of threats, violence, coercion, deception, and/or abuse of power.

In addition, more than 150 million children are subject to child labour, accounting for almost one in ten children around the world.

ILO has adopted a new legally binding Protocol designed to strengthen global efforts to eliminate forced labour, which entered into force In November 2016.

- An estimated 40.3 million people are in modem slavery, including 24.9 in forced labour and 15.4 million in forced marriage.
- There are 5.4 victims of modern slavery for every 1,000 people in the world
- 1 in 4 victims of modern slavery are children.
- Out of the 24.9 million people trapped in forced labour, 16 million people are exploited in the private sector such as domestic work, construction or agriculture; 4.8 million people in forced sexual exploitation, and 4 million people in forced labour imposed by state authorities.

Women and girls are disproportionately affected by forced labour, accounting for 99% of victims in the commercial sex industry, and 58% in other sectors.

The International Day for the Abolition of Slavery, 2 December, marlcs the date of the adoption, by the General Assembly, of the United Nations Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others (resolution 317(IV) of 2 December 1949).

The focus of this day is on eradicating contemporary forms of slavery, such as trafficking in persons, sexual exploitation, the worst forms of child labour, forced marriage, and the forced recruitment of children for use in armed conflict.

For a number of years now, I've been boring my family senseless by saying I wish I knew how to cook Thai food from scratch. So last year, they decided enough was enough and pooled their resources to buy me a one day Thai cookery course for my birthday. Obviously, what with Covid and lockdowns, it's taken a while to get the date arranged but at long last, it was booked for Sunday, 21st November and I thought you might be interested on how I got on.

I took myself off to the Braxted Park Cookery School in Witham and needed to be there by 9.15 so it was quite an early start. There were 10 of us and we were welcomed with tea, coffee & biscuits on arrival. We were a motley crew and got on really well.

We were taken into the kitchen and introduced to our instructor, a lovely Thai lady called Yui Miles, who was a Master Chef finalist. We were provided with all the ingredients and had our own aprons, food preparation area and hot plates.

In the morning, we cooked Pork Dumplings, Salmon red curry & Thai Jasmine rice which we ate for lunch along with fruit juice or wine, whichever we would prefer. During the afternoon, we tackled Chicken Thai green curry, sticky Asian style meatballs in Lettuce Cups & Thai spicy salad (Som Dtum) which we could take home in the plastic boxes we were advised to bring with us. There was so much food, I've been eating it for the last 2 days and it is really nice — I've certainly had no problem keeping warm with all that curry.

The course was really excellent. Yui was lovely and made the whole process very simple, she had two helpers who did the washing up (especially appreciated) and in fact they thought of everything. It was a wonderful day out and a brilliant present which I would recommend to anyone.

The Blond McIndoe Research Foundation

After a radio appeal by the late actor John Mills, I sent a donation to the Blond McIndoe Centre in East Grinstead, Sussex where important research was being made into the treatment of burns at the Queen Victoria Hospital.

A few years ago the charity moved from Sussex to the Royal College of surgeons in Lincoln's Inn Fields. My last cheque to East Grinstead was never cashed. I phoned the Queen Victoria Hospital and was given a new address. My new cheque was acknowledged with a very nice letter.

Imagine my surprise when an invitation arrived to an autumn drinks reception in the presence of our Royal Patron HRH the Princess Royal on 18th November 2021. So, out of the wardrobe came the trusty Jean Muir dress, ideal for the occasion.

It was wonderful to meet the plastic surgeons funded by the Research Foundation, the trustees and others connected with the medical side. The welcome was warm and friendly.

There were about fifty people present. The Princess, who was interested and knowledgeable, spoke to everyone in the room. Burns treatment has moved on since Archibald McIndoe looked after the RAF 'guinea pigs'. However surgeon Kate Harvey said that his pioneering techniques are still being used today, 80 years later.

Marking 10 years since the launch of Singing the Faith at Wesley's Chapel, a new resource - 'Praying with Hymns' – is due to be released later this month. Duncan Paterson and Choral Singing

Duncan has been organist and choirmaster at St Andrews in The Drive for 50 (+1) years. He was also the conductor of Ilford's Choral Society from 1 975 till it closed about 10 years ago, I sang with the Choral Society on and off from 1979 till the last concert.

Thanks to Duncan and his wonderful accompanist the late Jean Wilson, I was able to learn most of the well known choral works. Handel's Messiah was, for many years a 'nice little earner' as a large choir and audience could be guaranteed.

A notable 'one off' was Andrew Lloyd Webber's 'Requiem'. The young treble Dominic Kraemer sang the famous 'Pie Jesu' also performed for the Queen Mother's 100th birthday. While in Paris as a guest at a wedding, I turned on the TV and unexpectantly saw Dominic holding a pigeon (no prizes for guessing what he sang)*

During another concert at St Andrew's, a man came striding down the centre aisle. He called out 'Will the owner of ? ABC 123 ? Please move it, because it's blocking my driveway'.

Duncan didn't move. The soloists didn't move. The choir sat still. An audience member went out, moved her car and later declared to Jean Wilson that it wasn't in the way and Jeans daughter, the soprano Julia Wilson-James confirmed this on Saturday 20th November 2021. On this afternoon, a concert was held at St Andrews to celebrate Duncan's 51 years at the church.

Many of St Andrew's former choirboys, members of Ilford Choral Society, distinguished musicians and others connected with Duncan's teaching and musical life were in attendance.

The climax of the evening was when 'all singers' were invited to perform Mozart's 'Ave Verum' with Duncan conducting. This brought back so many memories of concerts and people no longer around.

Duncan Paterson - 50 (+1) years on the organ stool at St Andrews


2020 marked 50 years since Duncan Paterson took the post of organist at our neighbouring church on The Drive, St Andrew's. Unable to celebrate this milestone at the time, friends of Duncan filled the church on Saturday 201n November to hear musical tributes from a variety of performers and to be royally fed afterwards!

There were songs, a trumpet and four organists, including Duncan himself and the organist and assistant organist from Chelmsford Cathedral.

I first got to know Duncan when I was organist at Holy Trinity, BarkIngside in the late 80s. Duncan organised the Royal School of Church Music area festivals for the Chelmsford Diocese, and is still heavily involved with RSCM committees to this day. I also sang in one concert with the Ilford Choral Society which Duncan conducted for many years. Duncan has helped us out by accompanying at circuit events on more than one occasion.

The celebration was a joyous occasion, and there was genuine warmth and appreciation from all present for all the work Duncan has done for the musical life of llford and beyond.
